## **GENERAL INFORMATION**

The governing policy, rules and regulations of the Club will be established and may be altered as needed by the Ownership or Management. The General Manager, Director of Golf, and Golf Course Superintendent will enforce the rules and regulations pertaining to the use of the Club facilities.

Members and employees of the Club are instructed to report any violations of the rules to the General Manager who will enforce compliance. Members violating rules will be subject to such fines and penalties as set by Management.

### **Membership Reinstatement:**

An individual may reinstate their membership no earlier than one year after their resignation was effective with re-application to Membership, payment of current initiation fee and first months dues. The membership may be reinstated prior to one year by paying all back dues issued during the resignation period.

### **Membership Resignation:**

Resignation from Membership requires notice in writing 30 days in advance. All accounts must be paid in full.

### **Suggestions & Concerns:**

All suggestions and concerns regarding Club operation and service may be directed to the General Manager. Brownwood Country Club operates an 'open door policy' and can only improve with your help!!

### **Club Member Charges:**

Management will establish the charges for all services related to Country Club Membership privileges. Each Member will be billed for his/her accumulated account on the first of each month, all accounts are due on or before the 15th of each month. All Member charges are billed in arrears, Club dues are billed in advance.

Payments received after the 15th of the month will be considered delinquent and will incur a late fee of \$20. Non-payment of account within 30 days of the due date will result in suspension of charge privileges. Non-payment of account within 60 days of the due date will result in suspension of Club privileges. Non-payment of account within 90 days of the due date will result in automatic revocation of membership and legal action will be taken.

### **Letters of Recommendation:**

Upon request, the Clubhouse Office will issue letters of identification and/or recommendation for any Member in good standing to designated Country Clubs or in general form.

## **LOCAL GOLF RULES**

Play is governed by the U.S.G.A. Rules of Golf and its Decision Book and where applicable, by the following Local Rules. Conditions and definitions subject to changes and/or amendments by the Golf Professional.

1. **Out of Bounds:** Defined by white stakes defining property lines. The nearest points at ground level define out of bounds. The inside edge of all streets and fences bordering property define out of bounds. A ball is out of bounds when all of it lies out of bounds. Rule 27.
2. **Hazard:** Defined by yellow lines. A ball is in a hazard when any part of it lies in or touches the hazard.
3. **Lateral Hazard:** Defined by red lines. A ball is in a lateral hazard when any part of it lies in or touches the lateral hazard.
4. **Obstruction:** Anything artificial, including sprinkler heads, control boxes, all cement cart paths, or drain covers are obstructions.
5. **Embedded Ball:** A ball embedded in its own pitch-mark in the ground in any closely mown area 'through the green' may be lifted, cleaned and dropped, without penalty, as near as possible to the spot where it lay but not nearer the hole. The ball when dropped must first strike a part of the course 'through the green'. 'Closely mown area' means any area of the course, including paths through the rough, cut to fairway height or less.
6. **Ground Under Repair:** Enclosed white line areas define ground under repair. A ball is in ground under repair when it lies in or any part of it touches ground under repair. The line itself is ground under repair. Other areas of ground under repair, even though not so marked, include:
  - A. French drains (trenches that have sunk below the surface, may also be filled with small stone or the like)
  - B. Fire ant beds or mounds
  - C. Newly trenched areas and sod seamsRule 25-1. When in doubt of a ruling, play a second ball.
7. **Tree Wells:** Relief will be given only from tree wells designed to hold water.
8. **Yardage devices,** measuring distance only, will be allowed during tournament competition.
9. **Relief Procedure:** Stance plus one club length from the following areas:
  - A. Mulch
  - B. All areas covered in granite
11. **Bunker Rakes:** The U.S.G.A. recommends that rakes be placed inside the bunker where they are least likely to affect the movement of the ball. Rakes should be placed parallel inside the bunker approximately two feet from the edge.

# HANDICAPS

Maintaining an accurate handicap in accordance with the U.S.G.A. Rules is a personal responsibility. An accurate handicap is earned by posting a score (applying equitable stroke control according to your handicap) for all rounds of golf played.

A round of golf includes:

All 18-holes completed

Two consecutive 9-holes regardless of dates played

13 or more holes played

To arrive at your posting score when you play at least 13, but less than 18-holes, add to your cumulative score, adjusted according to your handicap, par for each remaining hole, plus the strokes you are entitled to for each hole, according to your handicap.

Equitable Stroke Control (E.S.C.) is the U.S.G.A. formula for adjusting your score for posting and handicap purposes.

(see chart below) Please post all scores in accordance with U.S.G.A. Rules...all scores properly adjusted.

An 'EGO handicap' hurts the individual and partner during team play. A 'sandbagger' is unfair to their fellow Club Members and competitors. An accurate handicap is representative of an individual's golf game.

All Members on the 2014 Handicap Roster will automatically be included in the 2015 Handicap Roster. The handicap fee is \$30 per person per year (billed annually in January). Brownwood Country Club uses the GHIN System for reporting handicaps. If you are a new Member or a new golfer and would like to establish a handicap, please submit at least five (5) 18-hole scorecards from Brownwood play and we will assign a handicap number for you.

At your request, we will provide you with an updated handicap report each month. Please see the Golf Shop for details.

# CLUB POLICIES

- ◆ Club Members and their families are entitled to the use of the Clubhouse with all its right and privileges, provided the same is exercised in conformity with the rules and regulations as adopted by Management.  
A Club Member's 'family' is defined to include his/her spouse, minor dependents (children under 21 years of age), or dependents under the age of 23 who are in college or military with the household as their permanent address.
- ◆ Guests of Members:  
Guests must be accompanied by a Brownwood Country Club Member at all times unless otherwise approved by Management.  
Members may entertain residents of Brown County, who are not members of the Club, not to exceed one time in any month excluding tournaments, civic organization meetings and private parties.  
Guests of card groups are required to pay a \$10 guest fee per person or order a food minimum of \$10 per person. Members in the card group are not required to meet the food minimum.  
Non-residents of Brown County may enjoy the facilities accompanied by a Brownwood Country Club Member without limit.  
Members are responsible for the conduct, appropriate dress and charges incurred by their guests.  
Use of Brownwood Country Club facilities by non-members and guests of members is a privilege extended by the owners of Brownwood Country Club. Club ownership or Management may, at any time, without stating reason, deny guest privileges to any individual when, in their opinion, it is in the best interest of the Club.
- ◆ Texas Alcoholic Beverage Commission (TABC) laws prohibit alcohol to be brought onto the premises and all alcohol consumed on the premises must be purchased from the Club. Violation of this State Law and Club rule could result in revocation of Membership and legal action. Persons 21 years of age and older are considered to be adults for the purchase and consumption of alcohol.
- ◆ Proper Country Club attire and conduct is required by all Members and Guests at all times.  
Swimwear, muscle shirts, tank tops or bare feet will not be permitted in the Clubhouse, on the golf course or on the practice areas. Proper attire for the Clubhouse is considered 'country club casual', unless otherwise specified by Management. Proper golf attire is required on the golf course and practice areas, shirts with a collar and sleeves (mock collar accepted) are considered appropriate for men, t-shirts are not appropriate attire. Sleeved or sleeveless shirts are considered appropriate for ladies. All shorts, men's or ladies, must be hemmed.  
Any Member or Guest engaged in or party to any conduct considered disorderly will be subject to a fine and suspension or expulsion from the Club. Members and Employees are instructed to report any violations of the rules to Management. Members or guests who damage Club property will be required to pay the cost of repair or replacement thereof.  
Management may impose such fines or suspension for destruction of Club property if it is determined that the act of the member was malicious, willful, or premeditated.
- ◆ The use of Private Party Rooms by Club Members is offered with a complimentary room rental fee.  
Non-Members wishing to use the Private Party Rooms will be charged a room rental fee.  
If any damage occurs during the event the Member, sponsoring Member or the renter will be responsible for repair or replacement thereof.
- ◆ Please observe the following:  
Do not remove Club property from the premises.  
Observe traffic and parking regulations with all forms of vehicles. Parking vehicles for the purpose of sale is prohibited.  
Posting of advertisement, solicitation, political campaign or articles for sale is prohibited, unless authorized by Management.  
Outside refreshments (food and drink) of any kind may not be served or consumed with the exception of licensed bakery goods approved by Events Director or Management.

## **CLUB POLICIES**

Please observe the following:

- ◆ Minors are not allowed in the Clubhouse Lounge unless accompanied by an adult.
- ◆ Members and Guests are asked to refrain from entering the kitchen area, back bar area and liquor storage unless accompanied by a Professional Staff Member.
- ◆ You must have a valid driver's license to drive a golf cart on Country Club property.

## **CLUBHOUSE LAKE**

Brownwood Country Club offers a 26-acre lake that is stocked with largemouth bass, catfish and crappie.

- ◆ All Members must check in the Golf Shop prior to proceeding to the lake for fishing.
- ◆ Guests must be accompanied by a Member and checked into the Golf Shop prior to fishing.
- ◆ Guest Lake Fees: \$10 per day, per person
- ◆ Brownwood Country Club memberships that include golf and recreational privileges also enjoy Clubhouse Lake privileges. Dining only memberships will incur a guest fee when enjoying the Clubhouse Lake and are limited to twice monthly.
- ◆ Brown County residents are limited to one time per month, accompanied by a Member.
- ◆ The Lake is open during Golf Shop hours and closed on Monday.
- ◆ All State safety laws apply including but not limited to the requirement of life jackets.
- ◆ Limit:

Largemouth Bass	January 1— May 15	Catch & Release
	May 16—December 31	3 fish per day, per person
All other species	Current State limits apply	
- ◆ Trespassers will be prosecuted.

## **PACE OF PLAY**

- ◆ The expected pace of play is 4 hours or less per 18-holes.
- ◆ Be at the ball, ready to hit, when it is your turn. Every time.
- ◆ Mark the ball's flight with a background object.
- ◆ Note distance, yardage, and wind before reaching the ball.
- ◆ Take 2 or 3 clubs to the ball.
- ◆ Limit practice swings to odd lies. Let one practice swing suffice.
- ◆ Start moving toward the ball immediately after it is hit.
- ◆ Study line of putt while others are preparing to putt.
- ◆ Limit search for lost ball to five (5) minutes. Hit provisional ball before searching (Rule 27).
- ◆ Consider other options for unplayable lie besides returning to spot of previous stroke (Rule 28).
- ◆ Invite others through when back up develops or hole opens up ahead.

## **HANDICAP FLAG USAGE**

Handicap flags are issued to Members who have an authorized letter from a physician or who possess a handicap parking pass from the Department of Motor Vehicles. The intent of a handicap flag is to allow a member who is medically impaired to have better access to their ball during play. Carts can cause significant damage to the course if taken into places which are restricted. The handicap flag holder's cooperation is very important.

Handicap flag holders are requested to sign an agreement stating that they will follow these guidelines:

- ◆ Flag will be flown on their side of the cart—easily visible.
- ◆ Flag will not be in effect when the Golf Course Superintendent deems condition of course is not cart accessible.
- ◆ Par 3 holes may be accessed.
- ◆ Flag will not be loaned to another player.
- ◆ Flag gives privileges only to holder and not to the other player in the cart.
- ◆ When there are more than two handicap players in the same foursome—they should share a flag/cart.
- ◆ Member will follow the 90-degree policy at all times.
- ◆ Member will keep their cart on the mowed approaches to the green and will not put the cart within 30 yards of a green, on a green slope or tee box

## **RESORT POOL**

- ◆ All Members and guests of Members using Brownwood Country Club Resort Pool and pool area do so at their own risk and Brownwood Country Club assumes no responsibility for accidents of any kind in or around the pool or for any ailments contracted.
- ◆ All Members are required to register themselves and their guests at the pool entrance before entering the Resort Pool area. Guests will be charged at the rate of \$10 per person and must be and remain accompanied by a member. Brown County residents that are non-members are limited to twice monthly.
- ◆ Brownwood Country Club memberships that include golf and recreational privileges also enjoy Resort Pool privileges. Dining only memberships will incur a guest fee when enjoying the Resort Pool and are limited to twice monthly.
- ◆ All children under eight (8) years of age must be accompanied, at all times, by a responsible adult. If going into deep water, a responsible person must be in the water with the child. If swimming in the kiddie pool, a responsible person may observe from the pool area.
- ◆ Persons having any skin disease, sore or inflamed abrasion, nasal or other discharge, or any communicable disease may be excluded from the pool.
- ◆ Persons having any considerable skin abrasion, open blisters, cuts, etc., may be excluded from the pool because of possible infection of others.
- ◆ Spitting, spouting of water, pushing, running, throwing an individual into water, towel popping, profanity and all other dangerous objectionable conduct is prohibited.
- ◆ Water toys (beach balls, inflatable animals, and small inner tubes) may be used in the pool for entertainment of small children. Large inner tubes, full-size mattress, and other water toys will not be allowed.
- ◆ Proper swimming attire shall be worn in the pool and pool area at all times.
- ◆ Outside food and drink will not be allowed in the pool area. All food and beverage must be purchased from Brownwood Country Club.
- ◆ Outside grills or open fires are not allowed.
- ◆ All pool parties must be scheduled through the Clubhouse Office during office hours.

## **BROWN COUNTY JUNIOR HIGH GOLF TEAM**

New to Brown County is the Junior High Golf Team, developed and introduced by Jimmy Tidwell, PGA in the Spring of 2015, this opportunity will keep kids involved in the game of golf from elementary age through high school and into college. ## **GOLF REGISTRATION**

- ◆ All golfers must register in the Golf Shop prior to play.
- ◆ All golfers must have their own golf clubs and bag to play. A rental club service is available if needed.
- ◆ All golfers and non-golfers are expected to follow the dress code. (please see the Club Policies section for details)
- ◆ Starting on the #10 tee is not permitted, unless approved by the Professional Golf Staff.

## **WALKING POLICY**

- ◆ Members and their guests may walk any time of the day, Tuesday—Sunday.
- ◆ Walking will not be permitted in Club tournaments.
- ◆ All pull carts must have wheel width approved by the Golf Shop.
- ◆ Pull carts are not allowed on tees, collars or shoulders of greens or in bunkers.
- ◆ Keep pull carts a minimum of five (5) paces from the green.

## **GOLF GUEST PLAY**

- ◆ Guest Fees: 18-holes Weekdays/Weekends \$45 9-holes: Weekdays/Weekends \$30
- ◆ Family Fun Rate: (immediate family ONLY)  
18-holes: Weekdays/Weekends \$35 9-holes: Weekdays/Weekends \$20
- ◆ Junior Guest Fee: (17 years & under)  
18-holes Weekdays/Weekends \$20 9-holes: Weekdays/Weekends \$10
- ◆ Guests must be accompanied by a Member at all times unless pre-approved by the Professional Golf Staff.
- ◆ Members are responsible for the conduct and attire of their guests at all times. Please inform your guests of the dress code, alcohol policy, etc., prior to their arrival.
- ◆ Brown County residents are limited to one time per month, accompanied by a member.
- ◆ Brownwood Country Club Dining and Recreational Members are subject to guest fee and play limit.

## **GOLF COURSE PROPERTY**

- ◆ The golf course is considered private property. We do not condone any person or vehicle to travel on any portion of the golf course without prior approval. Any individuals, vehicles or homeowners that cause damage to the golf course will be held liable and billed for damages.
- ◆ The golfer is responsible for the flight of their golf ball and any damage it may cause to homes, vehicles, etc. If you or a guest causes damage to any said property please notify the owner of the property as soon as possible.
- ◆ Please respect the privacy of the homeowners and do not retrieve golf balls from private property.

## **CLUB GOLF CART USAGE**

- ◆ No one under the age of 16 is permitted to drive a golf cart. The driver must have a valid driver's license.
- ◆ No more than two riders per golf cart, unless authorized by the Professional Golf Staff.
- ◆ Golfers are responsible for observing the daily cart rule.
- ◆ Cart Fees: Per Rider 9-holes: \$6.25 18-holes: \$12.50
- ◆ NEW!!! Annual Cart Plan:  
Single Plan—\$900 Family Plan—\$1250  
Allows you to pay a one time annual fee for unlimited cart usage. Billing options include annually in December or quarterly, restrictions apply. Please contact the Golf Shop for more information on cart plan benefits and restrictions.

## **PRIVATE CART USAGE & STORAGE**

- ◆ NEW IN 2015!! The Professional Golf Staff must inspect carts and the inspection sticker properly displayed on the vehicle in order to use the private cart on the golf course.
- ◆ Members who ride with a Private Cart owner are still required to pay a cart fee.
- ◆ Private carts may not be trailered onto Club property unless previously approved by Professional Golf Staff. (tournament use only)
- ◆ Trail Fee: (billed monthly) \$20 Private Cart Storage: (billed monthly) \$30

## **ETIQUETTE**

Please observe golf etiquette as set forth in the current 'U.S.G.A. Rules of Golf' with a special notice to the following:

- ◆ If a group fails to keep pace on the course and loses more than one clear hole from the players in front, they should allow the group following to pass or simply skip a hole to catch up.
- ◆ No player should play until the players in front are out of range.
- ◆ Players searching for a ball should signal the players behind them to pass as soon as it becomes apparent that the ball will not be easily found. They should not search for more than five minutes before doing so. They should discontinue play until the players following them have passed and are out of range.
- ◆ Players should, when the play of a hole has been completed, immediately leave the green.
- ◆ Players may not practice on the golf course.
  
- ◆ Texas Alcoholic Beverage Commission (TABC) laws prohibit alcohol to be brought onto the premises and all alcohol consumed on the premises must be purchased from the Club. Violation of this State Law and Club rule could result in revocation of Membership and legal action.
